A. PUBLIC OUTREACH REPORT

Consultant Radnich provided an outreach report including the following:

- September 6-22 The Greater Joshua Tree Art Expo event from 6:00 pm 9:00 pm.
- October 19- The Great Shake Out event at Jack in the Box parking lot from 9:00 am 3:00 pm
- The MWA grant for the Conservation Media Messaging Campaign launches on September 20, 2024, through May 2025.

B. US WATER ALLIANCE PRESENTATION

General Manager Johnson introduced the US Water Alliance team to the board. Consultants Carrie Smith and Austin Thompson-Spain presented an overview of their organization's work. They highlighted that the US Water Alliance provides free technical assistance to communities, focusing on improving drinking water, wastewater, and stormwater infrastructure. They also emphasized their role in helping communities access federal funding for these projects.

Floen shared that during a Copper Mountain Mesa Association (CMMA) breakfast meeting,
there was a discussion about customers experiencing significant water loss, resulting in a high
water bill. Instead of offering personal opinions, Floen recommended that the customer to
contact our Customer Support team for assistance. Later, Floen received a thank-you email from
the customer, expressing gratitude for the support they received in resolving the issue. Floen
commended the Customer Support Specialists for their excellent service.

Vice President Doolittle

- Doolittle shared a news story in Miami about a criminal impersonating a water inspector to gain entry into a home and steal personal belongings. Doolittle suggested that the district issue important messaging to inform and protect ratepayers from similar scams.
- Doolittle mentioned that she was pleased to see Kathleen Radnich, the Public Outreach Consultant, attend the Lovemore Ranch housing development meeting.
- Doolittle mentioned that the meeting minutes have morphed over time and do not include the director's comments on specific agenda items.
- Doolittle suggested proposing Ad Hoc meetings.
- Doolittle suggested charging the tier 1 rates for the CAAP program for customers who need help with a large bill due to a leak.
- Doolittle commended the district's website and praised the staff involved.
